### STICKER SHOCK

Los Alamos County DWI Coordinator David Sims (in foreground), Los Alamos County Probation Officer Lori Edmonds (kneeling) and a group of local volunteers placed reminder stickers on specific types of alcoholic beverages this morning at Smith's on Central to remind Fourth of July party givers and goers of the severe consequences of providing alcohol to minors as part of a national sticker shock program.

Providing alcohol to minors is illegal and can result in a 4th degree felony, 18 months in jail and a \$5,000 fine.

Project Sticker Shock is designed to reach adults who might purchase alcohol legally and provide it to minors. Stickers warning about the penalties for furnishing alcohol to minors are placed on all multi-packs of beer, wine coolers and other alcohol products that might appeal to underage drinkers.
